

Why this guy?



- HighMark School Development
 - ✓ Since 2005, ≈ 60 charter school facility projects in 15 states
 - √ \$600 million deployed as education facility developer
 - √ 3 million+ SF of school spaces = 69 acres
 - Nearly ALL charters
- Prior: Largest charter school builder in the US
 - ✓ ≈ 400 new-builds & renovation; ≈ \$650 million in construction; 20 states
 - ✓ 5.6 million SF of charter school spaces = 128.5 acres




Why this guy?


- Perspective . . .
 - Ohio Stadium = 12-acre footprint
 - 69 Acres (developer) + 128.5 Acres (builder) =
 - 197.5 acres of (almost exclusively) charter school spaces
- Not one man's opinion

 - ✓ Facts, patterns, best practices, and norms



16.5 X Ohio Stadium Footprint





Using the word "estimates"




Discuss "targets."
They demonstrate intention. Early estimates are irresponsible.

2. Flawed Thinking



Thinking like a charity or a traditional district



Think like a business.
Don't fear the profit.

3. Wrong Sizing



Under budgeting rent & over sizing spaces




Target 15-20% for rent.

Target 65-75 SF/student.

matter.


5. Expectation Errors

Failing to check references




Call, visit sites, interview with past clients, review documents, dig deeply.

10. Wrong Questions




Failing to ask the right questions



11. Denial – Presumed Malice






Failing to deal with or deliver bad news

Information is neutral.
Assume no malice. Shift targets.

12. No Backup Plan



Failing to have a backup plan



Keep a contingency plan until you have a guaranteed move-in date.


